

## **SILENT PLAN - Synopsis**

Kemal, Mustafa, Asya, and Leyla... Four deaf young individuals. For years, they have been recording the voices of their loved ones, holding onto the hope that one day they might be able to hear them. These recordings are not just memories—they are echoes of love preserved in silence, waiting for a future where sound might return.
